What Will It Cost Me?

There would be no sin in the world if people had to taste the bitterness of it first, and the sweetness of it last. Unfortunately, however, the devil places a thick coat of sugar over the bitterness of sin so that we taste its sweetness first and its bitterness last. Someone said once, "Everything has to be paid for in life. Good things are paid for before you get them; bad things are paid for afterwards." How true this is of life.

Love, for example, is paid for in advance in the discipline it costs in being a person capable of loving and worthy of being loved. TWO PILLARS OF THE CHURCH

hat a remarkable contribution these two men, Saints Peter and Paul, made to the early history of Christianity! No wonder the Church has always honored them together as the two leading figures of apostolic times.

These two giants of the Church were quite dissimilar. Peter was a fisherman, Paul a scholar. Peter was married, Paul was single. Peter was a simple, impulsive man. Paul was a thinker and philosopher. But they had one thing in common: they were one in their devotion to Christ and in their labors for the Christian faith. And both sealed with their blood the testimony of their faith.

Peter was one of the Twelve Apostles, considered a leader of the apostolic group along with James and John. Christ Himself vested a sacred trust in Peter. His name means "rock", from the Greek word "petra". His missionary activities began on Pentecost Day when he preached to thousands and brought them into the kingdom of God. He established the Church in Antioch, Syria, and that apostolic and patriarchal Church remains to this day as a fruit of his labors.

Paul, while not one of the original Twelve, considered himself a true Apostle of Christ. Indeed, he became the greatest of the apostles in zeal and sacrifice for the Gospel. Paul called himself "The Apostle of the Gentiles." (Romans 11:13), converting many to the newborn Faith. He wrote Epistles, he travelled extensively, he preached everywhere, he established churches, and suffered wounds for the faith. Finally, he was arrested and brought to trial in Rome and martyred about the year 67.

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
