(Commemorating the Venerable Pymen the Great; Synaxis of Serbian Saints)

Today's Epistle Reading: EPISTLE: 2 Cor 4: 6-15 **Today's Gospel Readings:** 

MATINS: Lk. 24: 1-12/LITURGY: Matthew 22: 35-46

**Troparion:** "The Angelic Powers were at Thy Tomb, the guards became as dead men! Mary stood by Thy Grave, seeking Thy most-Pure Body; Thou didst capture hell, not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life! O Lord, Who didst rise from the dead, Glory to Thee!"

**Kontakion:** "When Christ God, the Giver of Life, raised all of the dead from the valleys of misery with His mighty hand, He bestowed resurrection on the human race. He is the Savior of all, the Resurrection, the Life, and the God of all!"

Spiritual Food: One of the things that we forget in life amidst all its challenges is that God is guiding and directing our paths EVERY step of the way WHEN we let Him. That, of course, is the challenge: how to 'get out of God's way' through submitting to HIS will and HIS Plan for our lives? The BEST way to do this is to read His Word - Holy Scriptures and to apply it to our daily lives. Secondly, we are asked to do our very best to be as Christlike as possible with family, friends, foes, co-workers, etc., whomever God has put in our daily lives. ## TWO GREAT MISSIONARIES

hen we read that Jesus chose only twelve Apostles to lead His Church and then compare this figure with the multitudes that soon became followers of Christ, we get an idea of the great missionary efforts of the Early Church. Christ chose imperfect men, along with their sins, fears, vices and shortcomings, to spread the Word. From their experiences, they knew human weakness and how much mankind was in need of God's mercy.

Two important figures in this missionary outreach were **SAINTS BARTHOLOMEW AND TITUS.** Both Mark and Luke number Bartholomew among the disciples of Christ. He preached the Gospel in Asia Minor, and is said to have been martyred in Armenia about the middle of the first century.

Saint Titus is associated with the Apostle Paul, who converted him to the Christian faith, and found in him a zealous and faithful servant of Christ. Titus was put in charge of the Church on the island of Crete, scene of an ancient civilization and culture in the Mediterranean Sea. Titus is said to have lived a long life, and fell asleep in Christ about the year 107 at the age of 95.

The Apostle Paul wrote one of his epistles to Titus, referring to him as "my own son after the common faith." He gives his disciple some practical advice concerning the organization of a church, how it is to be administered, what it is to teach and how its members are to live.

These two devoted men realized the need for spreading the Good News to all. Similarly, WE must continue to press forward in proclaiming the Gospel and teaching the Christian way of life.
