Today's Epistle Reading: Today's Gospel Readings:

EPISTLE: 2 Cor 6: 16-7:1) MATINS: Lk. 24: 36-53/LITURGY: Mt. 15: 21-28/Jn 3: 13-17

Troparion: "Thou didst descend from on high, O Merciful One! Thou didst accept the three-day burial, to free us from our sufferings! O Lord, our Life and Resurrection: 'Glory to Thee!' Spiritual Food: Today, we share with you a tremendous loss - for my own personal family, for our Parish Family, for our Serbian Orthodox Family, and for the Orthodox Church Family as a whole - in the sudden, tragic death of +Proto-Stavrofor Dragan Filipovic last week. In these times of uncertainty, a societal trend to minimize the Teachings of the Church to somehow make it 'more acceptable' to all people (as if it wasn't!), +Proto Dragan stood out amongst his peers and those he served as the perfect example of what it meant to live "the one thing needful" - because that was how he lived his life - constantly exemplifying one who lived out God's Word in his life - not perfectly, of course, but in a manner that demonstrated that 'the Word of God' was his goal, was his compass, and was his companion in all life's situations that came his way! Those of us who knew and loved him, and also those who found him to be an irascible, stubborn Serbian (and there were some!) all could say without a doubt that his motivation was always to better the Church, to better the parishes he served, and to better the society that we lived in. It is my humble opinion that because of his decades of serving his Church, both within the Serbian Archdiocese, as well as the OCA and the Greeks, and doing it sacrificially, without any desire to be in the limelight, God answered one of Proto Dragan's favorite liturgical petitions, "...a Christian ending to our life - painless, blameless, and peaceful..." by blessing him during his regular afternoon nap to make his journey to the Kingdom! For those of you who only knew of him by name, or as an occasional visitor to our parish, understand that our Church has lost a TRUE servant of our Lord; yet, his legacy of self-less service, and total dedication to our Faith will live on! "Memory Eternal, dear Proto Dragan!" We will always lift you up in prayer!
