THE NATIVITY OF THE HOLY VIRGIN

oday we observe the Birth of the Theotokos. It is the coming of a child who was most wanted, prayed for, highly beloved and well-nurtured. The feastday serves as a lesson for our times.

The parents were Saints Joachim and Anna, sometimes lovingly referred to in ancient writings as the "parents of God" because of family descent. He was of the family of King David. Tradition tells of his prayer one day in the temple, of the refusal by a high priest of his sacrifice, and of the subsequent pouring out his heart in prayer and grief. Anna, too, was profoundly sorrowful at the lack of a child in their home.

An Angel of the Lord revealed to them the coming birth of a child, and there was great rejoicing in anticipation. There was born to them a daughter, and they named her Mary (Miriam in Hebrew). All the relatives and neighbors came to share in the joy of the birth. It wasn't long before the Church set the date in its calendar of Feastdays, and the rejoicing in the nativity of the Birthgiver of God has continued to this day.

Traditional iconography of the nativity shows St. Anna partially reclining in bed, eyes focused on the newly-born Mary, held by a midwife. Servants minister to the infant and the mother. A bath is prepared for the child. St. Joachim is depicted with the mother and child.

Surely our times need to learn the lessons this feastday teaches about the sanctity of life, children, parents, and home. Forces are tearing apart these building blocks of society, bringing untold sorrow and tragedy where joy and gladness ought to reign.
