
A DREAM BECOMES A REALITY

n his ill-fated campaign for the Presidency in 1968, the late senator Robert F. Kennedy would frequently paraphrase the words of playwright George Bernard Shaw at the conclusion of his speeches: "Some men see things the way they are and say 'Why?" I dream things that never were and say 'Why not?" The implication was clear: Kennedy wanted to portray himself as a man who would not be afraid to boldly venture in areas that others would timidly avoid. The same can be said about the monastery featured on today's bulletin and it's founder.

The RILA MONASTERY was started in the first half of the 10th century. It was through the tireless resolve of ST. JOHN OF RILA and his companions that it would become one of the main monastic centers of Bulgaria. It flourished greatly in the 13th and 14th centuries, was burnt down in 1833 and rebuilt from the ground up. For generations, it has served as a beacon of Christianity. But it took the pious devotion, inspired vision and endless drive of a poor monk for his DREAM to become a REALITY.

In Proverbs 16:3, we are instructed "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and He will establish your plans." Be sure not to merely be a "dreamer" but a "doer." With sweat, determination and hard work, may we honor our Lord, as He watches over our every action.
