o you remember the Gospel story where Christ is confronted by a wealthy young man who wants to know what he must do to gain eternal life? Our Lord's answer — "Sell all that you have and come, follow Me" — caused the lad to hang his head and walk away, for his world apparently revolved around his material possessions.

Fortunately, there have been many pious people throughout the course of Church History who have been able to understand that a Christian's goal must be storing up treasures in heaven, not here on earth! One such person was **ST. HILARION THE GREAT**, who literally walked away from a life of luxury, content to spend his years as a humble ascetic.

Hilarion was born in 293 A.D. in the village of Tabatha near Gaza in Palestine. At an early age, he was sent to Alexandria by his wealthy parents so that he could receive a well-rounded eduction in this ancient center of learning. It wasn't the arts or sciences that attracted his interest, however. Hilarion immersed himself in the teachings and doctrines of the Christian faith. After his formal baptism into Christianity, Hilarion embarked upon a strict monastic lifestyle in the deserts of Egypt. He sought out the famous St. Anthony the Great, whose wise counsel aided him greatly in his quest for spiritual perfection.

After several years, Hilarion returned to his Palestinian homeland, where he discovered that his parents had died. He disposed of the vast fortune which he had inherited and returned to the solitude that the quiet desert was able to offer him. He fell asleep in the Lord in Cyprus at the age of 80.
