GAINING SALVATION BY LOSING A LIFE

or many, the road leading to Christ is a long and winding one. Some of the Church's most revered saints initially lived sinful, shameful lives. The saints depicted on the cover of today's Bulletin – **BONIFACE** and **AGLAE** – bear witness to this.

Boniface and Aglae were both pagans living in an immoral relationship. Aglae, a very superstitious woman, convinced Boniface that he should travel to Asia and bring back a relic of a Christian martyr, which she thought would bring them good fortune, and would protect their household from evil.

Soon, Boniface arrived in Tarsus, where he witnessed a great number of Christians facing terrible torture for their beliefs. He was greatly moved by what he saw, repenting, not only for the unthinkable mission that had brought him to Tarsus, but for all of the sins of his life! Boldly, Boniface cried out among the other martyrs: "I, TOO, AM A CHRISTIAN!" Arrested immediately, Boniface was tortured and executed as well.

The servants who had accompanied Boniface to Tarsus brought his body back to Aglae. Prior to their arrival, an angel appeared to her, revealing to Aglae all that had happened. The angel left her with these words: "TAKE HIS BODY BACK, FOR HE IS NOW THE GUARDIAN OF YOUR SOUL AND THE PROTECTOR OF YOUR LIFE."

How ironic it is that the relic Aglae was to ultimately receive was that of her beloved Boniface! She buried his body and built a church over it. Giving away her many worldly possessions, Aglae embraced Christianity, and spent the rest of her life in penitence.
